Action in Maturity takes great pride in our many community partnerships – connections that put AIM at the very heart of an ecosystem of supports for Baltimore City. Through our robust transportation program and process for referring constituents to the supports they need, AIM has realized synergies of service with the Baltimore City Department of Health, MTA, over 40 senior buildings, and numerous agencies that claim a mission to provide services to older adults.

One partner, St. Mary's Outreach Center (SMOC), stands out as particularly complementary. Our closer relationship was forged in a Covid-related collaboration to provide referrals, food, and supplies to a cohort we largely share. The collaboration has proven such a success that we are now working with SMOC more strategically and purposefully than ever, even providing operational oversight to SMOC following coordination of their move closer to AIM, to office space in Keswick's Wise and Well Center. Together with SMOC, we envision improved outcomes for our seniors via SMOC's coordinated case management, AIM transportation, and joint senior center activities.

So, to rely on a particularly apt cliché, SMOC and AIM together are more than the sum of their parts.

What an exciting move forward for both organizations! More importantly, what an offering to Baltimore's seniors: a broader, deeper scope of transportation and wraparound services that will empower them to age in place independently and with dignity.
